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"HE HAS MADE ALL THINGS BEAUTIFUL IN HIS TIME".

- ECCLESIASTES 3:11

One of my favorite visuals is the "birth" of the butterfly. Our Creator God, in His "let me blow your mind" intricacy decided that a caterpillar would become a butterfly. An insect that once could simply crawl around would one day take flight.

To bring this into being, He decided to use the cocoon as the transformative "hub". I looked a little further into this process, and it is not a sweet hibernation period like I thought! On the contrary, this dark, isolated phase literally brings a death to the caterpillar so that a new body and being can be created.

First, the caterpillar digests itself, releasing enzymes to dissolve all of its tissues. Certain highly organized groups of cells known as imaginal discs survive the digestive process. Those discs then use the protein-rich soup all around them to fuel the rapid cell division required to form the wings, antennae, legs, eyes, and all the other features of an adult butterfly.

Once the butterfly has formed, it then goes through a struggle phase to fight its way out of the cocoon. If this process is interrupted, the butterfly will not fully develop nor will it be able to fly.

There is purpose in the process.

Sis, if you feel like you are in that dark cocoon right now, take heart! It is always in the darkness, in the desert, in the valley, in the wilderness where God speaks to us, rescues us, restores us, redeems us. It is here in the trial, when we lean on and turn to Him, that we gain the strength to soar.

Don't give up. Again, "He has made all things beautiful in His time.".
